General Camp Information

Eligibility

Enrollment is open to all children in grades K-6 in 2008-2009.

Our camps will be held at Gilmer Elementary.

Registration & Payment

To register, you must complete a registration form for each child. You may use the registration form found in this brochure or the form found online. Full payment or a payment plan will be required at the time of registration.

Class Size

Classes are filled on a first-come, first-serve basis. After a class reaches its enrollment capacity, a waiting list will be started. Please register early to avoid the waiting list!

What to Wear

Please make sure that your child has on appropriate shoes for his or her particular activity. Please send your child in clothes that can get dirty or messy. Dress code is informal, but campers must use good judgment in their choice of clothing. Clothing may not display logos suggesting sexual, alcohol, or drug-related themes or any offensive language. Please clearly mark your child's name on everything that he or she brings to camp.

Transportation

Transportation will not be provided. If a student is being picked up by some other than the person designated, please call ahead and make arrangements with the office.

Breakfast/Lunch

Breakfast and lunch will be provided free of charge. Students eating breakfast should arrive no later than 7:45.

Behavioral Problems

If there is a situation regarding your child's misbehavior, the instructor or coach of that particular camp will take your child aside and remind them of proper behavior. If the problem persists, your child will be taken to the Summer Program Coordinator where they will try to resolve the problem and will notify the parent or guardian. If the problem continues, your child will be removed from the program and no refund will be given.

Changes & Refunds

Withdrawals prior to June 4 will be assessed a \$25 processing fee; these withdrawals must be in writing. There will be no refunds for withdrawals after June 5. We will not pro-rate the cost of any week-long program.
